Principal's Message

Well, here we are approaching the end of another busy term. We are very grateful that Remote Learning 4.0 only affected us for a short time and that we were able to have a largely uninterrupted term of learning. The teachers have completed their mid-year monitoring and assessments in preparation for the reports, which will come home late next week. Given the disruption of 2020, we are very pleased with the learning progress being made by the children.

We are also in the process of monitoring the learning progress of the children involved in the tutoring and literacy intervention program, with the intention of adjusting those groups for Term 3. Parents of children participating in the tutoring program will receive additional information in their child's report and progress can be discussed at Student Progress Conferences early next term.

Student Progress Conferences will be held in Week 1 next term; on the evening of Wednesday July 14th and Thursday July 15th, and **all day Friday 16th July.** Conference bookings will open in COMPASS next week. As with previous conferences, children attend the conference with their parents/carers so there will be no school for children on July 16th. Please contact the school if you need support in accessing COMPASS or making a booking.

Our focus for Positive Education for the last two weeks of the term is **Positive Relationships** - Forgiveness. Forgiveness is one of our school values and it underpins our belief that practicing forgiveness has enormous benefits for both the forgiver and forgivee (if that's a word!). Forgiveness is another character strength, which involves forgiving those who have wronged or offended us. Forgiveness entails accepting the shortcomings of others, giving people a second chance, and putting aside the temptation to hold a grudge or behave vengefully. Forgiveness allows us to put aside the self-destructive negativity associated with anger and to extend mercy towards a transgressor. When we can forgive someone, we have healthier relationships, better psychological wellbeing, less stress and hostility, a greater sense of calm and less anxiety. Next week we welcome our **DSSI Teaching Partners** for the final time. The Teaching Partners (Chelsea Arnott and Jane Dunn) have been supporting the development of our Literacy Program for 18 months. They have worked closely with our teachers in their classrooms; modelling, coaching and mentoring teachers as they implemented effective reading and writing programs across the school. They have led the professional learning of teachers and supported them in their planning and the development of whole-school curriculum documents.

Having the Teaching Partners in our school has been a huge support to me in leading school improvement, and they have made an enormous difference to the teachers and their students. We are very grateful for the opportunity this initiative has offered us and really appreciate their support in building our capacity as effective teachers in literacy. However, we are very fortunate to have been part of a trial in which Hayley Jones has worked with Chelsea Arnott this year as an acting Teaching Partner, which means we will continue to benefit from their influence into the future.

We are very excited to announce some winners of the recent **Glenelg Shire Council Bushfire Colouring Competition**. The judge, Troy Lovett, a proud Gunditjmara and Yorta-Yorta man, was impressed by the creativity of these artworks and of all the artwork submitted by our students. **Our winners are Isla Saunders, Lily Johnstone, Elva Cook, Ruby Rudge, Zac Berry and Hugo Kent.** The children will receive some very generous awards next week at our final assembly for the term.

Now seems a very good time to gently remind families that the payment of school fees would be very much appreciated. The payment of school fees makes a very big difference to the resources and experiences we are able to provide for the children. At this stage, 52% of families have paid their contribution, so any improvement on that figure would be fantastic!

Next Wednesday will be our final assembly for the term. We have our fingers crossed that restrictions will allow us to have visitors into the school to celebrate the end of term. **4/5R are our Class in Focus**, and we look forward to hearing all about their achievements for the term.

We also have our fingers crossed that restrictions will further ease and the **school photos scheduled for next Tuesday June 22nd** can go ahead as planned. We will confirm those arrangements as soon as we are able to.

We know that a family's engagement in their child's education is a key factor in that child's success in school. Therefore, the School Council has established a **Community Engagement sub-committee**, which aims to improve family engagement in our school and greater involvement for parents as we collaborate to support every child's progress and achievement. 
A copy of the Vacation Care program flyer will be distributed to each local Primary school a month prior to the school holidays commencing, early enrolment is encouraged.
